ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

VISA & PASSPORT

To enter Bali, a visa is required for most travelers, with options depending on the length and purpose of your stay. Many nationalities, including those from the US, UK, Australia, and much of Europe, are eligible for a Visa on Arrival (VOA), which allows a stay of up to 30 days and can be extended once for another 30 days. This visa can be obtained upon arrival at Bali's Ngurah Rai International Airport for a fee of 500,000 IDR (approximately \$35 USD) or applied for online in advance through Indonesia's official e-Visa system, offering added convenience and faster processing at the airport. Payment can be made via cash or card. Ensure your passport is valid for at least 6 months from the date of entry, and have proof of onward travel, such as a return ticket. Checking the latest visa requirements based on your nationality and travel plans is recommended to ensure a hassle-free entry process.

HOW LONG TO VISIT

IDEAL LENGTH

7 - 10 days

The ideal length of stay in Bali depends on how much you want to explore and the pace you prefer, but a 7-10 day trip is perfect for most travelers. This timeframe allows you to experience Bali's diverse attractions without feeling rushed.

CLOTHING



Lightweight, Breathable Clothes: Pack loose, airy fabrics like cotton or linen for the hot and humid

weather.

Swimwear: Bring multiple swimsuits for beach days, pool lounging, or snorkeling adventures.

Cover-ups/Sarongs: Useful for beach visits and as temple attire.

Comfortable Shoes: Flip-flops for the beach, sandals for casual wear, and sturdy sneakers or hiking shoes for trekking.

Modest Attire: Carry at least one outfit with covered shoulders and knees for visiting temples (or pair a sarong with a shirt).



Daypack/Backpack: For day trips, hikes, or excursions.

Reusable Water Bottle: Many places have water refill stations to help reduce plastic waste. It is not recommended to drink the tap water in Bali, so being able to refill your own water bottle from the drinking stations is helpful.

Power Adapter: Bali uses a Type C or F plug with 230V, so bring an adapter if needed.

Rain Gear: A compact umbrella or lightweight rain jacket is handy during the wet season.

SUN PROTECTION



protect marine life while snorkeling or diving. Sunglasses: With UV protection. Wide-Brim Hat/Cap: For extra sun coverage.

After-Sun Lotion: To soothe skin after long days in the sun.



HEALTH & SAFETY

Insect Repellent: Preferably with DEET to

ward off mosquitoes.

Small First Aid Kit: Include essentials like band-aids, pain relievers, antihistamines, and motion sickness pills.

Medications: Bring any prescription meds and consider anti-diarrheal tablets for potential stomach upsets.

GOOD TO HAVE



Cash to Convert: Many places prefer cash, and small bills are useful for tipping or small purchases.

Travel Insurance: Covering health, loss, and activities like scuba diving or trekking.

Camera or Drone: For capturing Bali's beauty, especially underwater.

Wash Cloths: If you prefer to use a wash cloth it is recommended to bring your own as many of the villas and resorts do not provide any.

Laundry Bag: Useful for separating wet or dirty clothes.

GRAB & GOJEK

Using Grab and Gojek in Bali is an incredibly convenient and affordable way to navigate the island. These popular ride-hailing apps offer a variety of services, from car and scooter rides to food delivery, package delivery, and even ondemand massages or cleaning services. Both apps are user-friendly and allow you to book rides quickly while providing fare estimates before confirming your trip. Be sure to download both apps before arriving and link them to a credit card or pay by cash for seamless use.

WHATSAPP

Having WhatsApp is incredibly useful when visiting Bali due to its widespread use among locals and tourists alike. It's the goto communication tool for arranging transportation, such as contacting drivers or ride-hailing services like Gojek and Grab. Many local businesses, including restaurants, spas, and tour operators, use WhatsApp for bookings and inquiries, making it easy to plan your activities. Additionally, it allows for seamless communication with accommodation providers or travel companions, especially when you have access to Wi-Fi or a local SIM card. With its ability to share locations, photos, and quick messages, WhatsApp ensures you stay connected and organized throughout your trip.





DATA ESIM

Having a SIM card for data is crucial when visiting Bali, especially since your cellphone service may not work without an international plan. Many travelers find their home network doesn't provide coverage in Bali, or international roaming charges are prohibitively expensive. Companies like Airalo, Holafly, Nomad, Ubigi, and local providers like Smartfrenand Telkomsel offer eSIM options that are affordable and easy to activate. These eSIMs ensure you stay connected with essential apps like Google Maps for navigation, Gojek or Grab for transportation, and WhatsApp for communicating with locals or booking services. With data, you can easily check restaurant reviews, share travel experiences online, and stay in touch with family back home, all without relying on costly international plans.

MONEY CONVERSION APP

> Having a money conversion app or using Google's built-in currency converter is essential when traveling to Bali, as the Indonesian Rupiah (IDR) is the only accepted currency on the island. Apps like XE Currency or Currency Converter Plus offer real-time exchange rates, allowing you to easily calculate costs while shopping, dining, or booking activities. For a quick and reliable alternative, you can use Google by typing "IDR to [your currency]" into the search bar for instant conversions. These tools are particularly handy for understanding prices in cash-based transactions, such as in local markets, small warungs (local eateries), or when tipping. Since international currencies are not accepted, having a conversion app ensures you're aware of the value of your money and can confidently navigate Bali's vibrant economy.



PREFERRED LANGUAGE

BAHASA INDONESIAN

English is commonly spoken as well

The preferred language in Bali is Bahasa Indonesia, the official language of Indonesia, used for formal communication, education, and business. However, the Balinese people also speak their local language, Balinese, which is often used in traditional ceremonies, cultural settings, and among native speakers in daily life. In tourist areas like Ubud, Seminyak, and Canggu, English is widely spoken and understood, particularly by those in the hospitality and tourism industries, making it easy for visitors to navigate the island. While Bahasa Indonesia is the primary language, learning a few phrases in either Bahasa or Balinese can enhance your connection with the locals and show appreciation for their culture.



VISITING TEMPLES

Wearing a Sarong

When visiting temples in Bali, it's important to respect the sacred nature of these spaces by adhering to proper etiquette. Dress modestly by covering your knees; wearing a sarong and sash (often available for rent or loan at the temple) is customary and required. You may required to remove your shoes before entering the temple grounds and avoid stepping on thresholds, as they are considered sacred. Keep a respectful demeanor by speaking quietly and refraining from public displays of affection. Women who are menstruating are traditionally discouraged from entering temple areas, as they are considered ritually impure. Photography is generally allowed, but be mindful of signs prohibiting it in certain areas and avoid taking pictures during ceremonies without permission. By following these guidelines, you demonstrate respect for Balinese culture and spirituality.

ENTERING VILLAS & ROOMS

In Bali, removing your shoes before entering a villa is a common practice rooted in respect and cleanliness. It reflects the Balinese cultural value of maintaining harmony and keeping indoor spaces pure and free from the dirt of the outside world. Most villas will have a designated area near the entrance, such as a shoe rack or a mat, where guests can leave their footwear. This custom is not only practical, given Bali's outdoor lifestyle, but also a polite gesture that shows consideration for the hosts and their space. Observing this simple etiquette helps you integrate seamlessly into local customs and demonstrates appreciation for the Balinese way of life.

BALI OFFERINGS

Canang Sari

In Bali, daily offerings, known as canang sari, are an integral part of the island's spiritual life and are placed as acts of devotion to maintain balance and harmony with the universe. These small, colorful baskets made of palm leaves and filled with flowers, rice, incense, and other symbolic items can be found on sidewalks, in front of homes, temples, shops, and even on the beach. It's essential to respect these offerings by avoiding stepping on or disturbing them, as they are sacred and represent a deep connection to the Balinese Hindu faith. If you accidentally step on one, don't worry—just continue on your way without drawing attention to it. Observing these offerings with care and curiosity enriches your understanding of Bali's culture and spirituality, showing respect for the local traditions that define this beautiful island.

EXPRESSING GRATITUDE

Anjali Mudra

In Bali, expressing gratitude often goes beyond words and includes a respectful hand gesture known as anjali mudra. This involves bringing both palms together in a prayer-like position at chest level and slightly bowing your head while saying "Terima kasih" (thank you) or "Suksma" in Balinese. This gesture is not only a polite way to say thank you but also conveys humility and respect, reflecting the island's deeply spiritual and harmonious culture. You'll often see this gesture used during ceremonies, when receiving blessings, or in formal interactions. Visitors who incorporate this into their interactions with locals show an appreciation for Balinese traditions, fostering a warm and respectful connection.

PRIVATE DRIVER

\$30 - \$50 USD

While apps like Grab and Gojek are excellent options for short-distance travel in Bali, hiring a private driver is the best choice for longer day trips or exploring multiple destinations. For just \$30 to \$50 USD, you can book a private driver for 6 to 10 hours, offering incredible value for a full day of personalized transportation. Private drivers will take you anywhere around Bali, regardless of the distance, and often double as local guides, providing insights about the culture, recommending attractions, and even serving as translators. The fee typically includes parking fees, gas, and tolls, ensuring a hassle-free experience. Whether you're visiting temples, trekking to waterfalls, or exploring remote beaches, a private driver gives you the flexibility and comfort to fully enjoy Bali's beauty.

GETTING AROUND

MOTOR BIKE RENTAL \$3-\$7USD

> Renting a motorbike in Bali is an affordable and flexible way to explore the island, with daily rentals typically ranging from 50,000 to 100,000 IDR (\$3 to \$7 USD). While many rental shops don't require an international driver's license, it's smart to have one, as local police often stop tourists, and without a valid license, you could face a hefty fine. You can easily obtain an International Driving Permit (IDP) online through organizations like AAA for a small fee (around \$20 USD), which is valid for one year and allows you to legally ride in Bali and many other countries. Additionally, wearing a helmet is mandatory by law, and failure to do so can result in fines and increased risk of injury. Being prepared with the proper documentation and safety gear ensures a smooth, legal, and enjoyable motorbike experience on the island.
